



The teacher shortage in Nome and other villages continues. One Filipino teacher obtained a visa and came to Nome in March. However, some teachers are retiring or seeking employment elsewhere because their pay does not allow them to meet their daily needs. The schools have considerable funds that are being saved "for a rainy day." Meanwhile, it is "pouring" in Nome, and the situation will only get worse if no action is taken.

Childcare is available in the toddler room (lower level, off the hallway south of the parlors) for the full duration of the worship service for any wee ones ages 0 through 5 needing a place to wiggle and play. We always happily welcome children in the service but recognize that sometimes parents need a break so they can focus on worship.

Realm Privacy Settings Change Reminder: On Monday, May 13, you will receive an email from Realm, our church management system, alerting you to the fact that your privacy settings have been changed. *Do not be alarmed*; we have done this intentionally. As Pastor Jeff stated in his May *Narthex* article, the reason for it is this: "...there are many active church members and friends who are not able to see each other in the online directory in Realm, and we are going to change the settings for every church member and friend so y'all are visible to each other. This does not change the security of your information when it comes to outside actors, and it does not change your ability to be more restrictive about your personal privacy settings if you want. But it will change our community baseline so it's easier for people to find each other. As always, let us know if you have questions, ideas, or concerns."
